NOTICE OF ORDINANCE ADOPTION

TAKE NOTE THAT AT A REGULAR MEETING THE VILLAGE OF AKRON COUNCIL OF TUSCOLA COUNTY, MICHIGAN, HELD ON JULY 15TH, 2025, CONDUCTED AT THE VILLAGE HALL, UPON MOTION MADE, SECONDED, AND CARRIED, THE FOLLOWING ORDINANCE WAS ADOPTED.

**VILLAGE ORDINANCE CODE CHAPTER 9016-B AMENDMENT TO
ORDINANCE CODE CHAPTER 9016**

At a regular meeting of the Village of Akron Council, held on the 15th day of September 1998, conducted at the Akron Village Hall, upon motion made by _____, seconded by _____ and carried, the following Amendment to the Village of Akron Ordinance Code Chapter 9016 was adopted.

The Council of the Village of Akron, Tuscola County, Michigan, ordains:

That the Village Ordinance of the Village of Akron, commonly known as Ordinance Code Chapter 9016 (Disorderly Conduct), adopted February 15th, 1960 be amended as follows:

The Ordinance known as Ordinance code Chapter 9016 (Disorderly Conduct), shall no longer be included in the Village of Akron Ordinance Code Book.

The following additions shall be included in the Village Ordinance Code Chapter 9016 as Ordinance Code Chapter 9016-B (disorderly Conduct):

SECTION 1.

Any person is a disorderly person if the person is any of the following

- A. A PERSON OF SUFFICIENT ABILITY WHO REFUSES OR NEGLECTS TO SUPPORT HIS OR HER FAMILY.:
- B. A WINDOW PEEPER
- C. A PERSON WHO ENGAGES IN AN ILLEGAL OCCUPATION OR BUSINESS

- D. A PERSON WHO IS INTOXICATED IN A PUBLIC PLACE AND WHO IS EITHER ENDANGERING DIRECTLY THE SAFETY OF ANOTHER PERSON OR PROPERTY OR IS ACTING IN A MANNER THAT CAUSES A PUBLIC DISTURBANCE.
- E. A PERSON WHO IS ENGAGED IN INDECENT OR OBSCENE CONDUCT IN A PUBLIC PLACE.
- F. A PERSON FOUND BEGGING IN A PUBLIC PLACE.
- G. A PERSON KNOWINGLY LOITERS IN OR ABOUT A POLICE STATION, POLICE HEADQUARTERS, COUNTY JAIL, HOSPITAL, COURT BUILDING, OR OTHER PUBLIC BUILDINGS OR PLACE FOR THE PURPOSE OF SOLICITING EMPLOYMENT OR LEGAL SERVICES OR THE SERVICES OF SURETIES UPON CRIMINAL RECOGNIZANCES.
- H. A PERSON WHO IS FOUND JOSTLING OR ROUGHLY CROWDING PEOPLE UNNECESSARILY IN A PUBLIC PLACE.
- I. A PERSON WHO WILFULLY DESTROYS, DAMAGES, OR IN ANY MANNER DEFACES ANY PROPERTY NOT HIS OWN, OR ANY PUBLIC SCHOOL BUILDING, OR ANY BUILDING, BRIDGE, FIRE HYDRANT, STREET LIGHT, STREET SIGN, OR PARKING METER, OR MARK OR POST HANDBILLS ON, OR IN ANY MANNER MARK THE WALLS OF ANY PUBLIC BUILDING, OR DESTROY, TAKE OR MEDDLE WITH ANY PROPERTY BELONGING TO THE VILLAGE OR REMOVE THE SAME FROM THE BUILDING OR PLACE WHERE IT MAY BE KEPT, PLACED, OR STORED, WITHOUT PROPER AUTHORITY.
- J. A PERSON WHO INSULTS, ACCOSTS, MOLESTS, OR OTHERWISE ANNOYS, EITHER BY WORD OF MOUTH, SIGN OR MOTION, ANY PERSON IN ANY PUBLIC PLACE.
- K. A PERSON WHO ENGAGES IN ANY DISTURBANCE, FIGHT, OR QUARREL IN A PUBLIC PLACE.
- L. A PERSON WHO COLLECTS OR STANDS IN CROWDS, OR ARRANGES, ENCOURAGES, OR ABETS THE COLLECTION OF PERSONS IN CROWDS FOR ILLEGAL OR MISCHIEVOUS PURPOSES IN ANY PUBLIC PLACE.
- M. A PERSON WHO LOITERS ON ANY STREET OR SIDEWALK OR IN ANY PARK OR PUBLIC BUILDING OR CONDUCTS HIMSELF IN ANY PUBLIC PLACE SO AS TO OBSTRUCT THE FREE AND UNINTERRUPTED PASSAGE OF THE PUBLIC.

- N. A PERSON WHO ENGAGES IN ANY ACT OF PROSTITUTION.
- O. A PERSON WHO ATTENDS, FREQUENTS, OPERATES OR BE AN OCCUPANT OR INMATE OF ANY PLACE WHERE PROSTITUTION, GAMBLING, THE ILLEGAL SALE OF INTOXICATING LIQUOR, OR ANY OTHER ILLEGAL OR IMMORAL BUSINESS OR OCCUPATION IS PERMITTED OR CONDUCTED.
- P. A PERSON WHO DISTURBS THE PUBLIC PEACE AND QUIET BY LOUD, BOISTEROUS, OF VULGAR CONDUCT.
- Q. A PERSON WHO PERMITS OR SUFFERS ANY PLACE OCCUPIED OR CONTROLLED BY HIM TO BE A RESORT OF NOISY, BOISTEROUS, OR DISORDERLY PERSONS.
- R. A PERSON WHO OBSTRUCTS, RESISTS, HINDERS, OR OPPOSES ANY MEMBER OF THE POLICE FORCE, OR ANY POLICE OFFICER IN THE DISCHARGE OF HIS DUTIES AS SUCH.
- S. A PERSON WHO WANDERS ABOUT THE STREETS, EITHER BY DAY OR NIGHT, WITHOUT THE LAWFUL MEANS OF SUPPORT OR WITHOUT BEING ABLE TO GIVE A SATISFACTORY ACCOUNT OF HIMSELF.
- T. A PERSON WHO PROWLs ABOUT ANY ALLEY OR THE PRIVATE PREMISES OF ANY OTHER PERSON IN THE NIGHTTIME, WITHOUT AUTHORITY OR THE PERMISSION OF THE OWNER OF SUCH PREMISES.
- U. A PERSON WHO SPITS ON ANY SIDEWALK OR THE FLOOR OR SEAT OF ANY PUBLIC CARRIER, OR ON ANY FLOOR, WALL, SEAT OR EQUIPMENT OF ANY PLACE OF PUBLIC ASSEMBLAGE.

SECTION 2. PENALTY:

A person convicted of being a disorderly person shall be punished by a fine not to exceed one hundred (\$100) dollars or by imprisonment not to exceed 90 days or by both such fine and imprisonment, at the discretion of the court.

SECTION 3. VALIDITY:

Should and section, clause or paragraph of this Ordinance be declared by the court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, the same will not affect the validity of the Ordinance as a whole or part thereof other than the part declared to be invalid.

SECTION 4. EFFECTIVE DATE:

This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon publication as required by law.

VILLAGE OF AKRON
DISORDERLY PERSONS ORDINANCE
ORDINANCE NO. 1375

**AN ORDINANCE TO REGULATE DISORDERLY PERSONS WITHIN THE VILLAGE OF
AKRON.**

**BE IT ORDAINED BY THE VILLAGE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF AKRON,
MICHIGAN THAT:**

SECTION 1. DEFINITION:

Any person is a disorderly person if the person in any of the following:

1. A window peeper.
2. A person who is intoxicated in a public place and who is either endangering directly the safety of another person or property or is acting in a manner that causes a public disturbance.
3. A person who is engaged in indecent or obscene conduct in a public place.
4. A person who knowingly loiters in or about a place where an illegal occupation or business is being conducted.
5. A person who loiters in or about a police station, police headquarters building, county jail, hospital, court building, or other public building or place for the purpose of soliciting employment or legal services or the services of sureties upon criminal recognizances.
6. A person who is found jostling or crowding people unnecessarily in a public place.
7. A person who willfully destroys, damages, or in any manner defaces any property not his/her own, or any public-school building, any public building, bridge, fire hydrant, street light, street sign, or parking meter, or mark or post handbills on, or in any manner mar the walls of any public building, or destroy, take, or meddle with any property

belonging to the Village or remove the same from the building or place where it may be kept, placed, or stored, without proper authority.

8. A person who engages in any disturbance, fight, or quarrel in a public place.
9. A person who collects or stands in crowds, or arranges, encourages, or abets the collection of persons in crowds for illegal or mischievous purpose in any public place.
10. A person who loiters on any street or sidewalk or in any park or public so as to obstruct the free and uninterrupted passage of the public place.
11. A person who engages in any act of prostitution.
12. A person who attends, frequents, operates, or is an occupant of any place where prostitution, gambling, the illegal sale of intoxicating liquor, or any other illegal or immoral business or occupation is permitted or conducted.
13. A person who unreasonably disturbs the public peace and quiet by loud, boisterous, or vulgar conduct.
14. A person who permits or suffers any place occupied or controlled by him/her to be resort of noisy, boisterous, or disorderly person.
15. A person who prowls about any alley or the private premises of any other person in the nighttime, without authority or the permission of the owner of such premises.
16. A person who spits on the floor or seat of any public carrier, or on any floor, wall, seat, equipment of any place of public assemblage.

SECTION 2. PENALTY:

A person convicted of being a disorderly person shall be a misdemeanor and be punished by a fine of not to exceed one hundred (\$100) dollars or imprisonment not to exceed ninety (90) days or both such fine and imprisonment, at the discretion of the Court.

SECTION 3. VALIDITY:

- A. All Ordinances or part of this Ordinance in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.
- B. If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be held to be invalid or unenforceable for any reason, the invalidity or unenforceability of such section,

paragraph, clause or provision shall not affect any of the remaining provisions of this Ordinance.

SECTION 4. ORDINANCE IN FORCE:

This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval and publication by law.
